Punctuality and attendance

Having good attendance at nursery is really important in making sure that your child has the best opportunity to learn and develop well.

Please ensure that your child is on time for their nursery session every day (8.30am or 12.30pm) so that they do not miss any learning time. If your child is absent for any reason, please phone the nursery office on 02086840494 to let us know.

Safeguarding and Health & Safety

There has been an increasing number of older siblings entering our nursery at the end of the day. Whilst it is pleasing to see so many of them wanting to help collect the younger children it is also causing us a safeguarding concern. We pride ourselves in closely monitoring people coming in and out of the nursery to ensure the safety of the children attending THNS. This includes stopping children from running out of the doors at the end of the day if they have "escaped" from their parents/carers. In order to ensure our safeguarding systems are highly effective we will no longer be able to allow older siblings in to the nursery at the end of the day. They are welcome to wait in the small lobby area <u>however</u> if this becomes overcrowded with buggies and children they will be asked to wait outside on the ramp area. Our priority <u>has</u> to be the safety of the children attending THNS. We trust that you understand our concerns and that you will work with us to ensure the safety of the younger children. Pushchairs, prams and buggies

With the arrival of the cold, damp weather, many of you will have noticed the increase in the number of pushchairs and buggies parked in the office foyer. To avoid blocking our fire exit and to prevent our children becoming hurt, we are asking all parents to remove their children from their pushchairs if they are awake and park their empty pushchair in the red sheltered bay and <u>not</u> bring them into the waiting

area. The only exceptions will be buggies or pushchairs with <u>sleeping</u> children in them. Please be aware that parents who park their empty pushchairs in the foyer, will be asked to remove them. Your co-operation with this health and safety requirement is appreciated.

Cold weather and appropriate clothing

As the weather gets colder, please ensure that your child has a **labelled** thick coat, scarf, hat and gloves. Unfortunately we can not be responsible for items of clothing that go missing, especially if they have not been labelled with a name. We have a mud kitchen and lots of 'messy' play activities at nursery, so please make sure that children are dressed in clothing which you don't mind getting dirty. We promote independence as part of the nursery curriculum so please make sure that your child is able to dress and undress themselves.
