100% Attendance

Some of the children will be bringing home certificates this week in recognition of their outstanding attendance for this half term. Gold awards

We encourage children to celebrate their individual achievements on a daily basis in order to grow a sense of self pride but also to understand that we can be proud of others. This term we have launched our "Gold Award" certificates which focus on the Characteristics of Effective Learning which are: Playing & Exploring, Active Learning and Creating and Thinking Critically. Staff have had to make some very difficult choices about who to award a certificate to for this half term and I have been told several times that they could have awarded a certificate to each and

every child for various reasons. The Gold Award certificates will continue to be awarded throughout the year so please do not be disappointed if your child has not brought one home this time. There will be plenty more opportunities to be given a certificate.

Help please!!

Please could you remember to write your child's name in their clothes but particularly those clothes that might be removed during the day for example coats, hats etc. There are many children with the same items and it is very difficult for us to identify which coat belongs to who if the coats are identical. Although we teach the children to hang their coats on their own pegs they are often in such a rush to continue with their learning that they put them on the wrong peg or not on a peg at all!!

Safeguarding

Please remember to notify us if somebody different to the "norm" will be collecting your child. This is imperative to our safeguarding procedures. We operate a password system whereby you must give the office (if you telephone to notify us) or your child's keyworker a password that you have agreed with the person collecting your child. If we have <u>not</u> been notified of this we will not let the child go until we have contacted the person who usually collects.
