#### **Supporting Croydon Residents**

After receiving funding from government, the council has now launched a fund to support residents who are struggling to buy food, heat their home or purchase essentials such as fridge/freezer, oven/microwave, a bed or bedding.

Residents can refer themselves or a school can refer on a parent/carers' behalf, with their permission. Residents must be able to demonstrate that they do not have funds to cover the items being requested and will need to evidence any income and provide a bank statement.

#### **Punctuality and attendance**

We are very concerned about the number of late arrivals to the nursery each morning, this is not only unsettling for your own child but it can also cause a health & safety risk as we have to maintain a legal adult to child ratio and often have to move staff around at last minute to accommodate the children that have arrived late.

Our nursery morning session starts at **08.30am** with a 15min entry time. If your child arrives after **08.45am** they are recorded as being late on the register. Our focused teaching and learning groups start at 09.00am. If your child arrives after **09.00am** you might be asked to wait with them until our teaching and learning groups have finished to avoid disrupting the learning of others.

We understand that there are occasions that you might be running late which is entirely acceptable however continuous lateness does mean that your child is missing out on learning.

Please ensure that your child is on time for their nursery session every day (8.30am or 12.30pm) so that they do not miss any learning time. If your child is absent for any reason, please phone the nursery office on **020 86840494** to let us know.

#### Safeguarding and Health & Safety

There has been an increasing number of older siblings entering our nursery at the end of the day. Whilst it is pleasing to see so many of them wanting to help collect the younger children it is also causing us some concern. Please ensure that any siblings stay with you whilst you are waiting for your child. Our outdoor learning space is not to be used as a "playground" whilst you wait, many of the resources outside are bought specifically for nursery aged children and they are at risk of being damaged if older children are using them.



### **Cold weather and appropriate clothing**

As the weather gets colder, please ensure that your child has a <u>labelled</u> thick coat, scarf, hat and gloves. Unfortunately we can not be responsible for items of clothing that go missing, especially if they have not been labelled with a name. Gloves are particularly hard to keep track of, there are many companies that sell "clips" that can be used to attached gloves to a sleeve which might save you some money in the long run! We have a mud kitchen and lots of 'messy' play activities at nursery, so please make sure that children are dressed in clothing which you don't mind getting dirty. We promote independence as part of the nursery curriculum so please make sure that your child is able to put on their coat - there is a video on our website **thns.org/news/home-learning-dear-zoo** which demonstrates how we teach children to put their coat on independently.
