Safeguarding / Health & Safety

I am really concerned about the number of children that are being allowed to climb on the handrails of the ramp which leads in to the nursery. This is not only dangerous for them but also for others who might be walking by. There is also the risk of germs / bacteria transferring from the bottom of shoes on to a surface that is meant for little hands to hold on to! **Please do not allow your child / children to climb on the railings.**


Food: Please **DO NOT** give your child food to eat as they enter or exit the nursery. If your child is still eating their breakfast / lunch on arrival at the nursery they will need to finish eating before entering the nursery premises.

If they need a snack please wait until they have fully left the nursery premises before giving it to them—this includes left over food from their lunchboxes!



Attendance and punctuality

If your child is going to be absent from school please make sure that you let us know as soon as possible. If you call the nursery and select **OPTION 1** you can leave a message rather than having to speak to someone. Please ensure that you arrive at the nursery on time, lateness is disruptive to your child, other children and also teaching and learning. It also causes a safeguarding risk as this means the doors have to be opened outside of our agreed opening times.
