

numbers of people using the foodbank grow over the last couple of months to around the low 50s per week and anyone who buys food can see how food prices seem to keep rising. The donations really help us keep going - and also make us feel like we are supported by the community, which is quite a motivator! Please do let anyone know who you feel may need the foodbank. We don't ask any questions about why people need to use it. At St Albans Church we also have the community hub on Thursdays 11am - 1pm where people can come for advice from Trussell Trust (food parcels) or Citizens Advice.

Primary school applications

The application for primary school has to be made by 15th January 2026, this must be completed through e-admissions at **www.croydon.gov.uk/admissions**. This can be quite a daunting process and we recognise that for many of you this will be the first time you have had to make this type of application. If you need help to make the application please contact the school office and arrange a time with Caroline for some support. Many of the local schools are offering tours of their facilities to help you make a decision. Please check individual school websites for the date of these tours.
